Nevada HAND's Affordable Assisted Living Communities Host We Honor Veterans Ceremony

Resident veterans and spouses were presented with pins and Quilts of Valor® for their service

LAS VEGAS – In honor of Veterans Day, Nevada HAND partnered with CompassionCare Hospice, Valor Quilters of Nevada, and the Nevada Department of Veteran Services to host We Honor Veterans ceremonies to recognize veterans living at their two assisted living communities: Silver Sky and Silver Sky at Deer Springs.

Veterans who reside at Nevada HAND's HAND Senior Living communities were celebrated by friends, families, and neighbors as they received a special pin, certificate, and Quilt of Valor® for their service. A Quilt of Valor® (QOV) is a quality, handmade quilt that is machine or hand-quilted. It is awarded to a Service Member or Veteran who has been touched by war.

A Quilt of Valor is a treasured symbol of the nation's gratitude for many residents, like Joseph McNeal at Silver Sky at Deer Springs. Drafted into the United States army while in college, Joseph says that he is proud of the time he served because it gave him self-confidence and a will to succeed. "My Quilt of Valor is so special to me," he said at the ceremony. "It's too beautiful to use so I now have it framed in my home for everyone to see."

In total, 27 veterans and 16 spouses were honored during the ceremonies. To recognize their efforts for connecting veterans with the community, the Nevada Department of Veteran Services awarded Silver Sky and Silver Sky at Deer Springs a Certificate of Appreciation.
